Born in rural Exeter, Earl Mann attended schools in the Exeter area – Kaweah Elementary School and Exeter High School. He attended College of the Sequoias before entering the Air Force during the Korean Police action. He was discharged from the Air Force and worked for a year for the Bank of America in Visalia before returning to COS graduating and furthering his education at Fresno State College, majoring in Industrial Arts and Education. After receiving his BA degree and teaching credential he started his teaching career at Woodlake High School where he taught for 33 years before retiring in 1992. During this time he obtained a Life General Secondary, a Life Special Secondary in Industrial Arts and a Life Pupil Personal Credential. He has been interested in photography for many years and taught evening classes in photography at COS for many years. While teaching he continued his education at Fresno State College, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and Brooks Institute of Photography in Santa Barbara.

Following his retirement from teaching he was encouraged to run for the Woodlake High School Board of Trustees. In 1992 he was elected to serve the first of two terms on the Woodlake High School District Board. He served on the board for the Tulare County Organization for Vocational Education (TCOVE) during this same time serving as president of the TCOVE board for two terms. He was chairman of the Woodlake Charter Committee, helping draw up the charter for the city, which the voters approved in June of 2000. He has served on the Tulare County Redistricting committee in 2011.
