Adding Captions with Amara


Amara is a free cloud-based program that allows you to add your own captions to videos found online. Acceptable video formats include the following:

- Vimeo
- YouTube
- MP4
- WebM
- FLV
- OGG
- MP3

Instructions:

1. To get started, go to <u>Amara.org</u>.


2. Click "SIGN UP FOR FREE" or "Login" in the upper right-hand corner.



3. Log in with an existing identity or create an Amara account.


4. Once you're logged in, click "Begin" under "Subtitle in a Public Space" (this is the free version).



5. Enter the URL for the video you would like to subtitle, and click on "Begin".



6. To start adding subtitles, click on "Add a new language!" in the left sidebar or if you have subtitles, click on "Upload them directly." (Note: you can only upload files ending in SRT, SSA, SBV, DFXP, TXT, and VTT.)




7. After clicking on "Add a new language!" select the video language and the subtitle language.

8. Next, you will press the play button on the video and type the sounds and audio that you hear. (Note: You will get a warning if your subtitle exceeds 43 characters. If the audio is too fast, and you need to pause the video to catch up, you can use the tab key on your keyboard to pause the video.)


New to Amara? Here are some pointers. Click to hide. Reopen anytime from the tools menu (>> Show tutorial). Please go away. 9. Once you have finished typing the subtitles, click on "Yes, start syncing" in the upper right hand corner of the screen.



10. To sync, you can you can play the video and drag each end of the subtitle to the appropriate starting and stopping point in the timeline.



11. You can also see the keyboard controls for more commands.



12. Once all of the subtitles are synced, do a final review by click on the "Start review" button in the upper right hand corner.

Adding Amara Videos to Your Course Site

Instructions – In Canvas

Note: When a video you are adding to Canvas already has captions, you can embed the video code using the "Insert/edit Media" button on the Canvas Rich Content Editor toolbar when editing a page. This will enable you to play the video without leaving Canvas. Embedding a video into Canvas is the best way to do it **IF** the video already has captions.

If you are adding captions with Amara, it's a little trickier to embed the video. Instead, you can add a link in Canvas to the Amara video, where you will be able to view the video with the captions you just created. (The default for adding a link in Canvas is to have it open in a new tab.)

1. To get the URL for the Amara video, copy the URL for your video from the web browser.

2. Navigate to your course site in Canvas, and insert the link using the "Link to URL" tool.



3. Test your link! You have just made your video accessible to all of your students!
