1	Impromptu Speech about "Anything"
2	Enhancing a presentation with graphics, media, and objects by inserting and trimming audio, editing and adjusting pictures, adding action buttons and inserting hyperlinks
3	Enhancing charts for presentations by changing chart style and design, customize a chart, format chart elements, animate a chart, embed an Excel chart, link an Excel chart, and update an Excel worksheet
4	Working with advanced PowerPoint tools to draw and format connectors, customize animation effects, create custom slide layouts, format master text, and create templates
5	Add finishing touches to enhance a presentation by customizing background and themes, effectively use slide-show commands, set slide transitions and timings, animate text and objects, use proofing tools, and inspect and evaluate presentation
6	Inserting objects into a presentation by inserting text from MS Word, inserting and styling a picture, inserting text boxes, inserting charts (and editing chart data), inserting slides from other presentations, inserting tables, and inserting and formatting Word Art
7	Modifying a presentation by entering text in the outline view, formatting text, converting text to SmartArt, inserting and modifying shapes, aligning and grouping objects, and adding slide footers
8	Creating an effective presentation by effectively planning, entering text, adding new slides, applying various slide design themes, and using appropriate presentation views

1	Given the need to communicate information to an audience, students will be able to apply and integrate appropriate delivery techniques (i.e. persuasive, demonstrative, informative, etc.) into a variety of public speaking scenarios to a level of success of a C or better in a least four out of five presentations.
2	Given a communicative setting, students will be able to critically analyze audience need/feedback (both verbal and non-verbal) and modify/adapt their presentation to effectively communicate the message to their target audience to a level of success of a C or better in at least four out of five presentations.
3	Given the electronic presentation software available at the College, students will be able to design, develop, and visually enhance a presentation, clearly communicating information and/or data to an audience to a level of success of a C or better in at least two out of three presentations.

Assignment Type:	Details
Other	Demonstration Speech: Students will demonstrate a product/process.
Homework	PowerPoint: Students will develop a slideshow to be utilized in a presentation. (PowerPoint, Slides, etc.)
Reading	Chapter reading to supplement lecture material.
Writing	Students will write reflective papers, analyzing the basic structure of a presentation. Students may also write self-reflection papers, utilizing Ethos, Pathos, and Logos.
