New Business/ Discussion

- Liberal Arts/ University Studies Degrees
 - Up for 5-year review. Currently curriculum is updated by STSV/ Counselling.
 - Outcomes Assessment is a challenge without academic assignment directly related to program requirements.
 - STSV has reviewed data for the degrees and recommended placement with academic divisions for curriculum review & assessment.
 - Meta-Majors/ Giant Pathways teams may also be a good home for some degrees, but these are not yet developed.

STVS Degree Recommendations

On behalf of the Counseling division, we would like to share the following data before making any decisions regarding the Liberal Arts and University Studies degree, which are due for the 5 year review.

- 1. Liberal Arts with an emphasis of Arts and Humanities:
 - a. 30 students obtained this degree in 2019/2020
 - b. Students that received this degree also received another degree (96 total degrees)
 - c. This indicates that many of these students received two or more degrees.

Recommendation: The Fine Arts or Language Arts & Communication Studies division consider taking over degree and make the necessary revisions, as needed, appropriate to the division.

2. Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Communications:

- a. 82 students obtained this degree in 2019/2020
- b. Students that received this degree also received another degree (171 total degrees)
- c. This indicates that many of these students received two or more degrees.

Recommendation: The Language Arts & Communication Studies division consider taking over degree and make necessary revisions to degree, as needed, appropriate to the division.

3. Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Health and Physical Education:

- a. 20 students obtained this degree in 2019/2020
- b. This degree appears to be the primary degree for students
- This degree targets student athletes that plan to transfer onto a four-year university and continue to play their sport.

Recommendation: The Physical Education division consider taking over degree and make the necessary revisions, as needed, appropriate to the division.

4. Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Natural Science:

- a. 93 students obtained this degree in 2019-2020
- b. Students that received this degree also received another degree (72 total degrees)
- c. Of the 93 graduates, 70 of them had Nursing declared as a major at one point in time
- This degree is primarily used for students who would like to obtain a degree prior to getting into an Allied Health Program (i.e pre-nursing students get 5 additional points on the Nursing Matrix)



New Business/ Discussion

- CSU Ethnic Studies Requirement
 - CSU has released updated course competencies for Ethnic Studies.
 Updated EO 1100 is forthcoming.
 - DRAFT EO language for the new CSU GE area includes: "This lower-division, 3 semester (4 quarter) unit requirement fulfills Education Code Section 89032 and shall only be met by courses offered by the departments of African American, Asian American, Latina/o American or Native American Studies. Approved cross-listed courses and courses offered by departments with names related to the four listed departments, such as Pan-African Studies, American Indian Studies or Ethnic Studies, shall also meet this requirement. This requirement shall not be waived or substituted."
 - ETHN courses have been updated to reflect the approved core competencies and are in workflow.
 - Submissions for anticipated new GE area will be due in Feb.



New Business/Discussion

- Community College Ethnic Studies Definition and Courses
 - ASCCC is working on updates to Title 5 that would more specifically define ethnic studies as a discipline (in line with Ed Code) and add a GE competency requirement.
 - Locally our cross-list policy specifies that courses do not need to be cross-listed for articulation purposes or to meet degree/ certificate requirements.
 - Ethnic studies is a specialized discipline with specific knowledge and preparation. Where a course is cross-listed, there must be compelling evidence that the designation is appropriate and participating divisions must approve.
 - As CC chair, I do not recommend cross-listing courses to meet the CSU ETHN requirement at this time. We need more concrete information about the final CSU EO and likely Title 5 changes.



New Business/ Discussion

- Meta Majors Update
 - Collection of student feedback on Meta Majors has been completed.
 - Students support "Giant Pathways" as the name for Meta Majors!
 - The Taskforce is reviewing feedback and anticipates a final draft beginning the governance process at the start of Spring semester.
 - Next steps: Curriculum process for adding/ updating programs listed in Giant Pathways, possible success teams for each pathway.

Culturally Responsive Curriculum Training
