# New Business

## Equity Review Updates:

- From 8/1/23, 122 of 184 courses completed or in-progress were reviewed for equity (66%).
- Last year, by mid-April, 41 course reviews completed.
- Still work to do! Some reviews check yes, but description is thin – “yes” entered in the text field, or other non-specific response.

# DEI in Praxis

Equity Principle 1: Represent multiple cultures in textbooks & course materials; use low-cost and zero-cost textbooks; use Open Educational Resources

**Equity Principle (from DEI in Curriculum Tool):**

Represent textbooks and materials that include multiple cultures represented

**Level 1: Gearing Up--we/I are just starting:**

1. Create an equity-minded rubric for review of texts and materials.
2. Discuss and decide what the outcomes you will be measuring (e.g., frequency of diverse representation in images, authors, examples, etc.; feedback from students).

**Level 2: Action Ready--we are ready to start or have started and want to do more**

1. Use your equity-minded rubric to create a plan of action.
2. Design a timeline and decide which college groups to present the rubric and plan of action (i.e., curriculum, senate, department, etc.).

**Level 3: Growing and Scaling--we have been doing this work and want to scale up campuswide**

1. Update your rubric and plan of action based on the first years of implementation.
2. Access and review data (e.g., department data or course level data). Intentionally discuss data and measure outcomes for continuous reflection and strategies to try for improvement.

#### Summary

The Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act of 2021 was intended to improve the student transfer experience by simplifying the process by which California Community College (CCC) students enroll at either the California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) systems. At the time the law was passed, only 28% of students with a transfer goal successfully transferred within six years.

The STAR Act calls for the consolidation of two existing general education transfer pathways for CCC students into a singular pathway to either the CSU or UC systems by fall 2025. It required the Intersegmental Committee of the Academic Senates of the CSU, the UC and the CCC (ICAS) to establish that single pathway. Now called the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC), this single pathway reflects compromises across intersegmental faculty and institutional partners to meet the academic requirements necessary for transfer admission to the CSU and UC. In community colleges, Cal-GETC will replace course articulation with both the current Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) and CSU General Education Breadth pattern.
