Course Objectives:

	Course Objectives
1	Students will gain an understanding of experiences faced by Deaf people, and their varying degrees of participation in Deaf culture/Deaf community by analyzing the historical and current perspectives of the struggles and victories experienced by Deaf people.
2	Students will recognize and portray understanding of the social, emotional, vocational, intellectual, medical and linguistics aspects of Deaf culture in America and across the world.

Course Outcomes:

	Course Outcomes
1	Students will define culture and apply the definition by using examples of typical social norms of Deaf people.
2	Students will identify and describe how ASL fits into a discernible linguistic framework and pattern as well as basic values and behaviors of Deaf people in the United States related to language use.
3	Students will construct a detailed description of the census, racial/ethnic, education, employment, social/advocacy activities, family environment characteristics of the Deaf community.
4	Students will identify and describe the functions of various past and current devices/technology used by Deaf people, and how these devices have evolved over the years.



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Students will compare and contrast the changing image of Deaf people and how the changes have influenced the art of Deaf people such as the importance of past and present Deaf artists, writers, and storytellers who influenced Deaf culture and ASL.

Reading	Reading assignment may include: 1. Leigh, I; Andrews, J; and Harris, R. (2016). Deaf Culture: Exploring Deaf Communities in the United States. Plural Publishing.
	Students will have weekly reading assignments.
	2. Information on Internet resources for each topic may be provided in each learning module.
	3. Readings from current issues of journals, magazines and newspaper articles may be assigned where relevant
Writing	Writing assignments may include: An assigned culture research paper, requiring students to compare their own culture with Deaf culture, including similarities and differences. It needs to be three pages long with APA format.
Writing	Students will have a "take home" Final. They are to write an essay to four questions that the instructor has asked them to write about. The questions are cumulative from what students have learned throughout the semester.
Homework	Homework assignments include: Weekly discussion boards towards certain topics for each Module in Canvas about Deaf culture.
Homework	Students will be required to watch a movie "Through Deaf Eyes" on YouTube. Students will be asked to choose one Deaf person to read about their life history. Students will need to answer these questions with 2-3 sentences each under the "Assignment" tab in Canvas.
