2019-2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- 225 students were enrolled at UPHS.
- 455 students completed 792 COS class for 2414 credits.
- We require two years of foreign language. This is accomplished through COS courses.
- In 2020, ten students graduated from COS with an AA/AS degree.
 One earned four degrees and one earned two degrees.
- UPHS has had a total of 22 students graduate from COS the same year as high school with a total of 31+ degrees.
- Thirty graduates from 2020 stayed at COS this year. Twenty six graduates transferred to a four year university and one graduate enlisted in the US Air Force.

Last Fall, UPHS completed the accreditation requirements through WASC.

UPHS earned the maximum accreditation of six years.

Our 2020-2021 enrollment *245 students* 162 students are enrolled in COS courses attempting 895 total units.

The class of 2020 saw 30 students continue at COS.

at UPHS.




Concurrent enrollment involves high school students enrolling in college courses on a college campus or online. Students can earn credit that can also fulfill high school requirements.

Dual enrollment involves high school students enrolling in college courses on at participating high schools during the school day. All of our class counts towards fulfilling high school graduation.

- High school students are one of the fastest growing groups on campus (represents 12.7% of all COS students)
