Things to do before you start the CSU Application

- **Obtain copies of all your college transcripts and AP or IB Exam results.** You can obtain your COS unofficial transcript from Banner. Select "Student Records link" and then click on "Print Unofficial Transcript."
- **Identify the courses you will be enrolled in each term prior to transfer** (e.g. If you are applying for Fall transfer you need to know the courses you will take in Spring and Summer).
 - Some CSU majors and campuses are "**impacted**" and therefore have very specific admission requirements. For impacted majors/campuses and required courses: go to www.calstate.edu/ar/impactioninfo.shtml.
 - To find the equivalent COS courses necessary to meet your Admissions Requirements for your major you can go to www.assist.org or meet with a COS counselor.
- **Identify the courses you are using to fulfill the following CSU requirements and the term you took/will take each course. Refer to the CSU General Education requirements**
 - A1 – Oral Communication; (COMM 1, 4, 7, 8, 112)
 - A2 – Written Composition; (ENG 1)
 - A3 – Critical Thinking; (AJ 25, Engl 2, Phil 20, 25, Comm 5)
 - B4 – Math/Quantitative Reasoning; (Bus 20, 119, Math 5, 10, 11, 21, 35, 44, 70, 65, 66, 67, 80, 81, 154, SSCI 25)

□ **Additional Information you will need**

- **Annual Income**– If your parent's claim you as a dependent on their tax return, you'll need to know their annual income (pre-tax). Refer to tax records or pay stubs.
- **Parent's residency** (optional) – Know the date they moved to the state where they legally reside.
- **Social Security Number** (If you have one) – Otherwise leave blank.
- **Citizenship Status** – If you're not a U.S. citizen, know your immigration status and the type of visa you hold (such as F1).
- **Method of payment** – If you are going to pay by credit card; know the account number, expiration date, cardholder's name and billing address.

Starting the Application

- Go to <http://www.calstate.edu/apply> and scroll down to select "Term" then select "Apply". Either create your account or log in with your username and password, if previously created.

Note: Read the campus information before you start the application. The campus information provides important admission information and procedures, like deadlines for submitting transcripts.

Things to do before you start the UC Application

- **Obtain copies of all your college transcripts and AP or IB Exam results.**
 - In the UC application you are required to enter all college courses that you have taken. Don't enter classes and grades from memory. Misrepresenting your academic record can jeopardize your admissions.
 - If you have only attended COS you can obtain your unofficial transcript from Banner. Select "Student Records link" and then click on "Print Unofficial Transcript."
- **Create a Transfer Admission Planner (TAP) account at <https://uctap.universityofcalifornia.edu> to:**
 - Identify the courses you will be enrolled in prior to transfer for TAG and/or UC application (e.g. if you are applying for fall transfer you need to know the courses you will be taking for spring and summer terms).
 - **UC admissions is very competitive**, therefore make sure you have completed the courses required including strongly recommended courses for your major.
 - If you are not sure about what courses you need, go to www.assist.org or meet with a COS counselor.
- **Additional Information you will need**
 - **Activities and awards** – Prepare concise descriptions of your most significant awards and activities and the length of time involved
 - **Annual Income** (optional) – If your parent's claim you as a dependent on their tax return, you'll need to know their annual income (pre-tax). Refer to tax records or pay stubs.
 - **Parent's residency** (optional) – Know the date they moved to the state where they legally reside.
 - **Social Security Number** (If you have one) – Otherwise leave blank.
