




# Counseling Appointment Tips

# STUDENT EDUCATION PLAN (SEP)


- A semester-by-semester course planning that you and a Counselor create together based on what you want to do at COS
  - Lists classes to register on April 20-21, 2023
  - SEP does not = registering for Su/Fa 2023 classes
  - Attend build your schedule workshops
- Students will be given a 2-semester SEP plan
  - Focus on the 1st semester
  - Based on the Counseling meeting 2<sup>nd</sup> semester plan or a backup semester plan (Review the SEP notes for details)
  - Don't panic! Updates can be made to your SEP if your goal/classes changes later in the semester (September-October)




# English and Math Placement

- Based on high school performance (English/Math grades)
- Current high school GPA
- Students may see their SEP with a co-requisite support course
  - That means you must sign up for the math course and support course
    - Ex: Math 021 AND Math 321

- Consider how many hours you are hanging out with your friends...


